1. Pay Your Student Admission Deposit - complete the Student Admissions Deposit Form and return it in the envelope provided with your \$400.00 deposit. In order to reserve your space for the fall semester, the deposit must be **postmarked by May 1, 2010** or by the date stated in your acceptance letter. Deposits may be made anytime prior to May 1 and are fully refundable until that date. **No refunds are made after May 1.** Even if you have been awarded a scholarship, you must pay this deposit.

(If you are unable to pay due to financial hardship, contact the Admissions Office so that we may consult with the Financial Aid Office about your financial need.)

Payment of your deposit will generate the following items:

2. Your Longwood email address will be mailed to you. This email address will be our official method of contacting you, so please **check it often**. If you do not receive your email address in the mail within two weeks of your deposit, contact User Support Services at 434.395.4357.

3. Your invitation for Orientation and Registration will be mailed beginning in April with a comprehensive publication, "The Answer Book."

4. At Orientation, you will complete and submit the Room and Meal Plan application. Assignments will be emailed by early August. If you are unable to attend Orientation, you will receive instructions regarding the application around mid-June.

5. At Orientation, you will be given an opportunity to sign a release that gives us limited permission to discuss your educational records with parents(s), guardian(s), spouse or other relatives. Until that time, we will not discuss any personal education information with them.

6. Go to www.longwood.edu/health/index.htm and click on Immunization Requirements to obtain a Certificate of Immunization, which must be completed and returned by **July 10**. State law requires that all students provide proof of immunization against measles, rubella, mumps, polio, diphtheria, tetanus, hepatitis B, and meningitis. Screening for tuberculosis is also required.

7. Go to www.longwood.edu/studentaccounts/mpplan.htm for information on the monthly payment plan. On-line enrollment begins in mid-July.

8. Go to www.longwood.edu/studentaccounts/billingprocess.htm to learn about the ebill process. You will not be mailed a bill. Bills are due in early August.

9. Submit a final high school and/or college transcript(s) verifying graduation and/or successful completion of your latest semester. Registration for future semesters will be delayed if we have not received all prior transcripts.

March 1 - Priority date for filing financial aid application (Free Application for Federal Student Aid - FAFSA).

April - Estimated Financial Aid letters mailed.

April - Orientation and Registration invitation mailed after we have received your Student Admissions Deposit.

April - Financial Aid Awards emailed to you after we have received your Student Admissions Deposit.

May 1 - Student Admissions Deposit deadline. (postmarked) No refunds made after May 1.

June 2 - 12 - Complete and submit Room and Meal Plan application at Orientation.

June 2 - Transfer Orientation and Registration (see below).

June 4 - 12 - Freshman Orientation and Registration (see below).

June 15 - Deadline for submitting Disability Housing Accommodation Request.

July 10 - Deadline for submitting Certificate of Immunization.

Mid - July - Monthly Payment Plan enrollment opens on line.

Mid - July - Fall semester bills **emailed**.

Early August - Room assignments **emailed**.

Early August - Bills due.

August 19 - New students move-in.

August 20 - Final registration.

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FINANCIAL AID

www.longwood.edu/financialaid

Longwood strongly encourages all students in need of financial aid to complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. If you do not have access to the online FAFSA, a paper copy may be obtained from most high schools. Priority is given to students who apply by March 1. An estimated financial award letter based upon your unedited FAFSA information will be mailed in April. After your admission deposit is paid, your Longwood email address will be our method of sending the official award notification in April. Official award notification emails are not sent to a student until all requested application and verification documentation has been submitted. Students selected for merit-based scholarships will be notified by the end of March.

Residential and Commuter Life www.longwood.edu/rcl/

Longwood is a residential campus. All full-time freshman, transfer, and readmitted students live in “Longwood-managed” housing except those who choose to live with their immediate families in one of the eight surrounding counties or those who are over 23 years of age. Transfer and readmitted students may live in non-university housing if they have earned at least 57 Longwood recognized credit hours. Residence Hall Contracts are for the entire academic year (August - May). Room furnishings and a list of recommended items to bring are available in “The Answer Book” and on our website as are complete residential requirements and policies.

Special Housing Requests: Students who need housing accommodations due to a disability must have their formal request and paperwork submitted by June 15 to be considered for a special housing assignment. Requests and documentation must be submitted to Disability Services. Information presented on either Residential or Student Health forms is not sufficient to initiate this process.

Technology www.longwood.edu/helpdesk/laptop

Longwood requires that all students have laptop computers. Longwood has contracted with Dell Computer Corporation to offer laptop computers to Longwood students at substantial savings over retail prices. The laptop is not included in the tuition; it is purchased separately. Details and ordering information will be available at Orientation. Included in the tuition and fees are: Internet access from residence halls (port-per-pillow); user account for personal web pages; email; and basic cable TV.

Withdrawing Prior to the Beginning of the Semester

Once a deposit has been received, the University expects you to enroll. **If you submit a deposit and later decide to withdraw, you must notify the Admissions Office in writing (admissions@longwood.edu).** Deposits are refundable until May 1, 2010. (Please note: stopping payment on a deposit will not substitute for completing formal withdrawal procedures. In such cases, a returned item fee of \$50.00 will be owed in addition to the value of the original deposit.)

Once you have registered for classes, you must officially withdraw from the University before the first day of the academic term to prevent tuition and fee charges. A full-time student withdrawing during the first 6 days of the academic term will be assessed 5% of their room and board charges.
